## Nidec Kyoto Tower **Trivia**

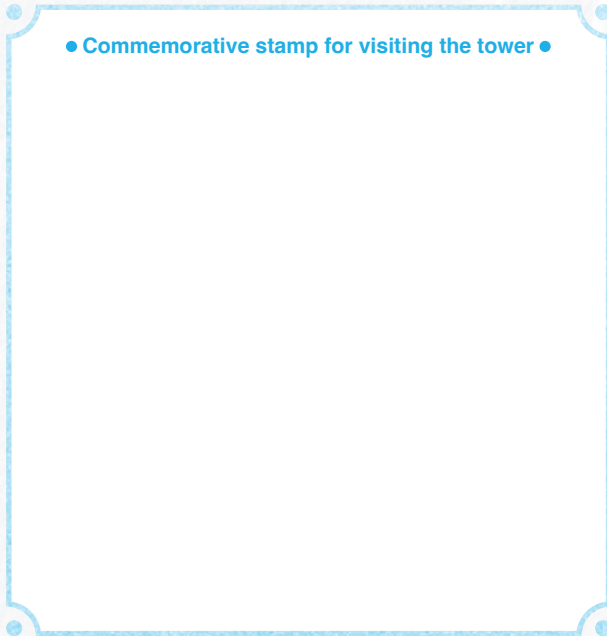
### Inspired by a Lighthouse Illuminating Kyoto

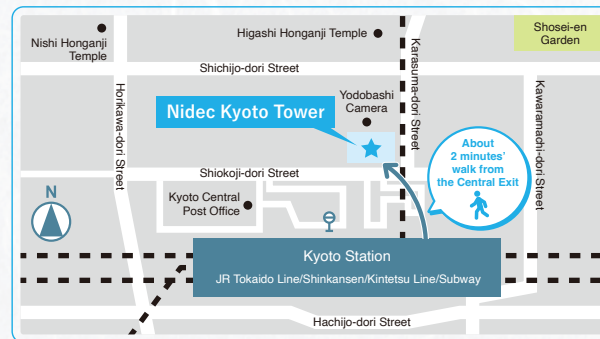

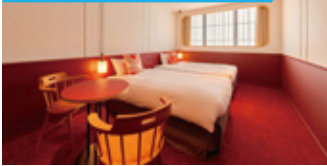

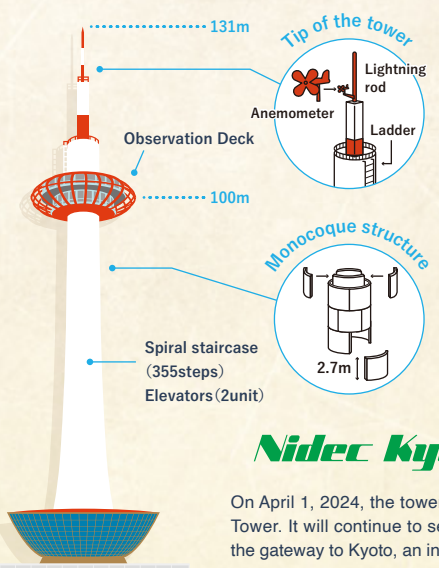
### Tower Illumination

The tower is illuminated by LED lights installed on the 3rd floor of the observation deck. While Nidec Kyoto Tower usually shines in white, it also features color illuminations as part of various awareness campaigns.

## The Birth of the tower

Before the tower was built, the Kyoto Central Post Office stood in its place. After the decision was made to relocate the post office in 1953, the Kyoto Industry and Tourism Center Co., Ltd. was established with the aim of creating a major center for industry, culture, and tourism at this gateway to Kyoto. In 1964, the year the Tokaido Shinkansen opened and the Tokyo Olympics were held, the Kyoto Tower Building was fully completed on December 25th. The observation deck opened three days later.



### The tallest structure in Kyoto city

Including the tip of its lightning rod, the tower stands 131 meters tall, making it the tallest structure in Kyoto City.

### World-class architectural structure

The tower is supported not by pillars, but by its outer "shell." This unique structure allows for its smooth, sleek form.

## Nidec Kyoto Tower

On April 1, 2024, the tower was renamed Nidec Kyoto Tower. It will continue to serve as a landmark befitting the gateway to Kyoto, an international city of culture.
